Looking ahead, an important decision is coming up for our city. On August 5, Novi voters will have the opportunity to decide on a Police & Fire Buildings Bond. This proposal seeks voter approval for significant investment in buildings and other infrastructure to replace, relocate, and consolidate the current police and fire headquarters and replace 3 of the 4 fire stations (upgrading the fourth). These facilities were mostly built in the late 1970s and early 1980s, and the plan being proposed to voters is intended to better serve the City's residents and businesses with modern, state-of-the-art facilities that will maintain or improve communication and response times and better accommodate the City's current co-ed public safety workforce.

We know how important it is to be informed, so we're offering **several Public Information Meetings** where residents can learn more, ask questions, and provide input. More information is included in this magazine and on the City's website at cityofnovi.org/2025bond.

Spring in Novi is always a special time, full of new beginnings, community spirit, and excitement for the future. I encourage you to get involved, stay informed, and enjoy all that our city has to offer. As always, my door is open, and I look forward to seeing you out and about this season!

FLOODPLAIN & FLOOD INSURANCE AWARENESS & INFORMATION SERVICE

Certain areas within Novi fall within the Floodplain or Floodway as designated by the Federal Emergency Management Administration (FEMA). Mandatory Flood insurance may be required. The City of Novi Community Development Department offers free floodplain determinations and will provide necessary floodplain information regarding your home or business. City staff provides flood protection and drainage advice to residents. Staff also makes on-site visits to offer technical information if you have flooding or drainage problems in your home or yard. Call the Community Development Department at 248.347.0415 to set up an appointment. Elevation Certificates for many structures within or near the floodplain are also available. Current FEMA and Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMS) are also available at cityofnovi.org. Information is also available on the FEMA website or floodsmart.gov.

FLOOD SAFETY TIPS

- 1. Keep all brush and debris out of streams and ditches; this helps flood water to flow freely.
- 2. Store valuables and insurance papers in a waterproof container.
- 3. Call (248) 347-0415 to find out if your property is in a flood risk zone.
- 4. Get a building permit before building in a flood plain.
- 5. If the road is underwater, turn around, dont' drown.
- 6. Ask your insurance agent if you are covered for flood damage.





NOVI'S PUBLIC SAFETY BOND PROPOSAL

Since Novi's Police Station and Fire Stations #1, #2, and #3 were built between 1978 and 1981, the City's population has more than tripled. With projections indicating that Novi will exceed 74,000 residents by 2050, the City has determined that these facilities need to be updated to meet modern public safety demands.

THE PURPOSE OF NEW FACILITIES

The current police and fire buildings were designed for a smaller community and do not have the space, layout, or resources to efficiently support today's emergency response operations. Additionally, these buildings were not designed with the modern co-ed workforce in mind. While renovations were considered, the original steel and concrete structural design makes remodeling difficult and costly. As a result, the Novi City Council has proposed a bond initiative to construct new facilities to serve the community for years to come.

WHAT IS BEING PROPOSED?

The proposed bond initiative seeks to invest \$120 million in new public safety facilities, road improvements, equipment, and technology over the next five years to be offset with a millage of 1-mill on real property in the City.

A key part of this proposal is the creation of a centralized Public Safety Headquarters, which would co-locate the Novi Police Station and Fire Station #1. This new facility would put police officers and firefighters "under the same roof" for purposes of communication and coordination. Additionally, the proposal includes extending Lee BeGole Drive to connect Crescent Boulevard south to Grand River Avenue, providing access for emergency vehicles and maintaining or reducing current response times.



If approved, **Novi would continue to have one of the lowest millage rates in Oakland County**, even with the proposed 1-mill increase.

The bond would fund:

- Modern buildings with updated layouts and equipment access, designed with response times in mind.
- Facilities specifically designed to meet current safety and health standards.
- New spaces to be made available for Public Safety programs, education, and outreach.
- Avoidance of costs for repairs and temporary fixes in the short-term.





STROKE GUIDELINES

HAVE BEEN UPDATED

HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW...

or the first time in a decade, the American Heart Association has updated its guidelines for the primary prevention of stroke. With research showing more than 80 percent of strokes are preventable through proper lifestyle modifications, promoting awareness of stroke prevention is a top priority for Henry Ford Providence Novi Hospital. Providence Novi is one of only 1.7 percent of hospitals in the U.S. accredited as a Comprehensive Stroke Center by The Joint Commission. CSC is the highest level of certification for hospitals with specific abilities to receive and treat the most complex stroke cases. Here, the stroke care team at Henry Ford Providence Novi Hospital shares key takeaways from the AHA's updated guidelines.

THE 8 ESSENTIALS FOR STROKE PREVENTION

Many updates to the stroke guidelines are connected to the AHA's Life's Essential 8, a list of lifestyle practices tied to a decreased risk for heart disease and stroke, including:

- Eating a healthy diet: For stroke, a Mediterraneanstyle diet is recommended. Prioritize lean protein, whole grains, fruits and vegetables.
- **Getting more exercise:** The updated guidelines come with a focus on screening for sedentary behaviors at doctor visits and counseling patients on ways to be active.
- Quitting tobacco use: Tobacco and nicotine products, used directly or through second and third hand exposure, can damage blood vessels and increase your risk for developing a stroke-causing clot.
- Getting good sleep: Promoting good sleep is an addition to the AHA's list. Getting consistent, good-quality sleep, helps lower blood pressure and reduce stroke risk.
- Maintaining a healthy weight: Working to manage your weight can help lower your risk for Type 2 diabetes and obesity.
- Monitoring cholesterol levels: Cholesterol can cause fatty buildups to form, narrowing your arteries and increasing your risk for blood vessel blockages to develop.

- Managing blood sugar: High blood sugar is common in individuals with diabetes. Over time, elevated blood sugar can cause damage to blood vessels.
- Controlling blood pressure: The guidelines modified healthy blood pressure numbers to be less than 130/80, a shift from the previous recommendation of less than 140/90.

SEX-SPECIFIC STROKE SCREENING RECOMMENDATIONS

Studies show a connection between hormonal changes women may experience and an increased risk for stroke. As a result, the guidelines now recommend additional screening for:

- Pregnant and postpartum women, as well as those who had complications with pregnancy
- · Women with endometriosis
- Those who have experienced premature (before age 40) or early (before age 45) menopause
- Transgender women taking estrogen

SPOT THE SIGNS

Time to call 911

While stroke prevention is the goal, knowing the signs of stroke is equally important.

REMEMBER B.E.F.A.S.T.

Balance, sudden loss of balance
Eyes, sudden vision loss or double/blurred vision
Facial drooping
Arm weakness
Slurred speech

Even if you experience stroke symptoms that seem to go away, seek immediate care. This could be a warning sign of a transient ischemia attack (TIA), which could precede a more severe stroke if not addressed quickly. 




